Welcome to Kristianstad, Skåne and Sweden

Kristianstad is a small town in the Skåne province and is located in the southernmost region of Sweden. Sweden is ranked among the world leaders in higher education.

Kristianstad

Kristianstad is a small town in the south of Sweden, located in the north eastern part of the Skåne province. The town was founded in 1614 by King Christian IV of Denmark, and its name literally means "Town of Christian" and historic buildings from that era still remain. From Kristianstad, you can easily get to Copenhagen, and from here travel further to the rest of Europe and all over the world.

Today, Kristianstad and its surroundings is home to 85 000 people (the town itself has 40 000 inhabitants). In the heart of Kristianstad there are theatres, nightclubs, shops and restaurants amid old houses and cobbled streets.

In all parts of Kristianstad you can easily get around by bike or on foot; there are plenty of trails that allow you to experience the beautiful landscape of the area. The town is renowned for its Vattenriket – the wetlands and grasslands designated as a biosphere reserve by UNESCO. Naturum, a newly-built nature centre, is situated close to the town centre and provides a number of displays illustrating the great biodiversity of the region.

The coastline near Kristianstad is over four miles long and offers beautiful beaches and shallow waters.

Kristianstad is situated within an easy reach of Europe by air, train or ferry. High-speed trains connect Kristianstad to Kastrup Airport, Copenhagen and Malmö. You can reach Malmö by train in one hour and Copenhagen within one and a half hours. You can thus enjoy the vibrant life of Malmö and Copenhagen whenever you want. Kristianstad airport offers direct flights to Stockholm.

In the whole municipality of Kristianstad you can easily move by bike or on foot; there are plenty of trails that allow you to experience the beautiful landscape of the area. Some of the trails are designed for easy access by wheelchair or with a pushchair.

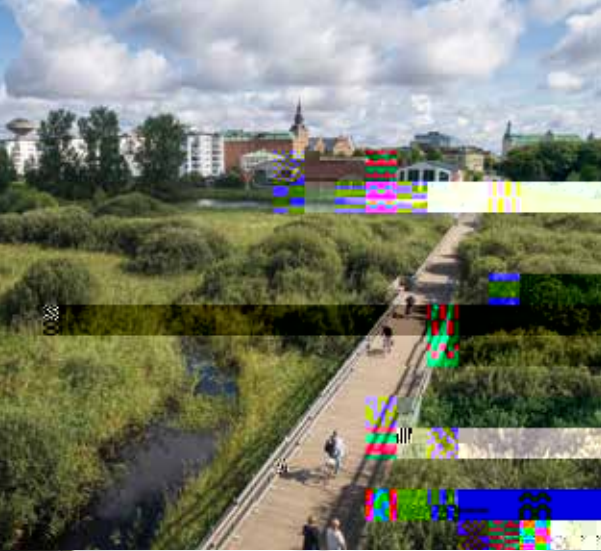

Skåne

Skåne (Scania) is the southernmost region of Sweden. Its history goes back to the Viking Age and Skåne is therefore full of historic buildings, museums and landmarks for you to explore. We also have castles that date back as early as the 11th century all over Skåne.


Together with the Danish Zealand, Skåne is part of the Greater Copenhagen – one of the fastest expanding areas in northern Europe. Along the coast you will find wide beaches and picturesque villages and inland you can discover wild nature, forests, lakes and open landscapes.

The northeastern part of Skåne (where Kristianstad is located) is also known as “The green part of Skåne”. The coastline is famous for its white sandy beaches and eel fishing. The sculpture park surrounding Wanås Castle is a must for any art lover.

Sweden

There are about 10 million people in Sweden. By area, it is the fourth largest country in Europe. Half of the land area is covered by forests, and less than ten per cent consist of farmland. The distance from north to south is 1 600 kilometres; the country incorporates a fairly wide spectrum of climatic zones.

Sweden is governed by a democracy and is known for its openness. The seasons here range from warm summer days to winter with sparkling snow. Many large international companies were founded by Swedes, such as IKEA, H&M and Spotify. Swedish music industry includes many well-known artists such as ABBA, Robyn and Icona Pop.
